

Summer Campus Housing Information 2023

Residing on the SIT Graduate Institute's campus provides a true living-learning environment that allows students to extend their academic learning. Personal growth, intellectual development, and appreciation of other cultures are just a few of the benefits afforded students who choose to become part of the SIT residential community.

SIT provides a range of living arrangements for its students. Residence halls vary in design from small two-story structures for approximately 12 students to a contemporary multipurpose building for 40 students.

TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION

Because each residence hall is unique in design, room sizes vary greatly. Most residence halls are co-ed, but single gender- and gender-neutral spaces can be provided.

All residence halls are furnished with shared bath facilities with separate male and female bathrooms. For gender-neutral housing, bathroom will be labeled unisex or gender neutral. The Student Health, Safety & Wellbeing office makes all room assignments.

Gender-neutral Housing: SIT offers gender-neutral housing, with facilities not restricted to traditional limitations of male/female gender designation. These spaces are offered based on their availability. Housing assignments are made on a case-by-case basis that recognizes the variability of individual needs and preferences and the fact that appropriate housing may be limited in number.

Possible residence hall assignments can include:

- single rooms where a unisex bathroom is in proximity
- single rooms with attached bathroom shared with another single room

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT HOUSING

Each of the residence halls is conveniently located within walking distance to classrooms, the library, and other important campus facilities. Please note that some residence halls are further from the center of campus than others. Each hall has a full kitchen where you can make your meals and lounge space.

Each student is provided with a single bed frame, mattress, pillow, comforter, desk and chair, desk lamp, trashcan, and closet space/bureau. All windows are provided with drapes or blinds. There are two laundry facilities on campus—in the International Center, and a large one in a separate building on the north side of campus. Weekly linen service consisting of sheets and towels is available in the summer.

Cars are permitted on campus and can be parked overnight in designated areas.

MEALS

Meal service is not provided. All students residing on campus will be responsible for their own food. Students will have access to kitchens to make food, resources about local restaurants will be available, and we have vans to offer transportation to grocery stores.

PERSONAL PROPERTY INSURANCE

SIT is not responsible for students' personal property located on its premises. Students are strongly encouraged to have personal property insurance for their belongings. This may be available and covered under applicable homeowners' insurance policies, or it is available as separate insurance coverage from many providers.
