

2022 SIT Graduate Institute Report on Graduation Rates

Graduation rates for students pursuing their Master's degree vary based on degree and modality. Degrees offered in the part-time hybrid modality have a four-year average of 91%, with the MA in International Education averaging 86% and MATESOL averaging 95%. Students enrolled in degrees in the full-time global modality have a three-year average of 70%. We have added one degree per year over this timeframe. Of these degrees, the MA in Climate Change and Global Sustainability, our longest running degree in this new modality, has the highest average at 81%. MA in Humanitarian Assistance and Crisis Management has an average of 68%. Launched in spring 2021, the MA in Diplomacy and International Relations has a graduation rate of 40%. Looking at the rates per year, we can infer that the pandemic had minimal impact on the graduation rates of students enrolled in part-time hybrid degrees whereas degrees in the global modality experienced significant impacts. SIT is monitoring these rates closely to determine whether the lower rates are the result of disruptions to education caused by the pandemic or a program design issue.
