

BELGRADE, SERBIA RESIDENCY

Arrival and Departure

Our summer residency will run in Belgrade, Serbia from May 26th to June 6th. Please book your flight to and from <u>BEG</u>, and plan on arriving on Sunday May 25th, the day prior to class start. Our first cohort gather will occur at 10:30 AM at our learning center, which is at the building of the <u>Faculty of Media and Communications Karadjordjeva 65 | 11000 Belgrade, Serbia</u>. Please make your departure flight on Saturday, June 7th.

Room and Board

You are responsible for making your hotel reservations for the duration of the seminar. Two hotels are within very short walking distance of the SIT learning center, the <u>Sava Mala Hotel</u> and the <u>Jump Inn Hotel</u>. Other hotels are available in Belgrade city center, a 15-20-minute walk from our learning center.

If enough students wish to stay at the Jump Inn Hotel, SIT may be able to secure a discount rate of approximately \$85 per night for a single room, or \$50 per night if you wish to share a double room with a peer. If you wish to take this option, please let Dr. Fridman know no later than March 1st Orli.Fridman@sit.edu.

Belgrade hotels include breakfast in their daily rate. You will be responsible for securing lunch and dinner daily. SIT will sponsor an opening reception with drinks and appetizers on the first night of the program, May 26th. SIT will also sponsor a closing dinner on Friday June 6th.

Residency Schedule

A detailed schedule on the Belgrade residency will be provided to you in April. It will include a program orientation, cohort-building activities, field visits to hear from guest speakers, group project activities, and the launch of your summer course *Theory and Polemics of International* Relations. Please expect a fully immersive experience during your stay in Belgrade. Free time will be limited. A detailed daily schedule will be provided to you no later than May 1st, 2025.

VISA Information

Entering Belgrade as an American citizen is possible for 90 days on a tourist visa. If not an American citizen please contact your admissions officer, Maira Tungatarova, who will assist you with visa requirements and information.
